(What does it look like?, What do you think it's made of?, How tall do you think it is?, What did you know notice in the picture?)</p>	<p>3</p> <p>Go for a walk in your town/neighborhood and look and describe the buildings around you and ask, "What buildings do you think we will see?" or "What do you think happens in this building?"</p>	<p>4</p> <p>Use the tabletop blocks and ask your child to construct a building seen in your neighborhood/town.</p>	<p>5</p> <p>Read a book with your child and ask questions that describe the buildings in the book.</p>	<p>6</p> <p>Look at pictures in a magazine/newspaper or book and ask your child to look for shapes on buildings.</p>
<p>9</p> <p>Ask your child to draw a picture of a building, seen on their walk around the neighborhood/town.</p>	<p>19</p> <p>Look online and have children identify some tools and clothing for people who work on buildings.</p>	<p>11</p> <p>On paper, ask your child to create a building, using craft sticks or Wiki Stix.</p>	<p>12</p> <p>Go outdoors with your child and ask, "What can we use outside to create a building together."</p>	<p>13</p> <p>Find a large empty box for children to use to construct a building.</p>

(gas stations, post office, city hall, police station, etc.)</p>	<p>17</p> <p>Take pictures of the outside of your home (with phone) and count the windows and doors.</p>	<p>18</p> <p>Read the Three Little Pigs and ask simple questions. (https://youtu.be/U4S1O0n74i8)</p>	<p>19</p> <p>Have your child draw a picture of his/her school and ask, "What is it made of?"</p>	<p>20</p> <p>Google/Name familiar tools that are used to build. (hammer, saw, screwdrivers and wrenches)</p>
<p>23</p> <p>Name familiar people who help maintain buildings. (maintenance worker, handyman, or electrician)</p>	<p>24</p> <p>Show your child different pictures of buildings and ask, "What happens inside this building?" (ex: grocery store, Lowes, gyms)</p>	<p>25</p> <p>Do a "mystery bag" and place a pretend tool in the bag and describe what they feel.</p>	<p>26</p> <p>Discuss with your child the different names of houses (apartment, cottage, cabin, hut, yurts)</p>	<p>27</p> <p>Read House Sweet House and ask simple questions. (https://youtu.be/wVT4wykTfZ8)</p>
<p>30</p> <p>Ask your child, "How many classrooms do you think are in their school."</p>
